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SUMMARY OF COURSE CONTENT:

This course is designed to bridge the gap between Ceramics Tech and AP3D and offer interested students in a higher level ceramics course. Students would explore more complex forms of both handbuilding & wheel throwing, incorporating more technology to create laser etched stamps, molds & 3D prints, mixing technology with traditional techniques. Students will elaborate on their glaze knowledge as well and try to create glazes to suit their pieces. Students will explore more community connections including potential installations at neighborhood restaurants/stores/throughout the school.
